U.S.-Soviet Relations and the Question
of Detente

Let's hope our third attempt to begin this season of the Omaha Committee is charmed. Our speaker and his subject certainly seem as fit and timely as our previous cancellees.

Mr. Dornberg joined Newsweek in 1965 and served as Bureau Chief there two and half years in Moscow before being ejected from the USSR. Isvestia accused him of taking part in preparing leaflets calling for the release of Soviet political prisoners. He denied the accusation. He has since left Newsweek to free lance and work on two books, a biographical profile of Leonid Breshnev and a book for young adults on the two Germanys. His most recent book was "The New Tsars--Russia under Stalin's Heirs."

A native of Erfurt, Germany, Mr. Dornberg is a graduate in journalism of the University of Denver and has been associated with the Overseas Weekly, the New York Herald Tribune, the Toronto Star, and Jerusalem Post. Other books he has authored are "Schizophrenic Germany" and "The Other Germany."

Other Foreign Affairs Committees who have met with Mr. Dornberg rate him most highly. Some have considered him their most successful speaker of the year. So this might be a meeting to which you would like to bring a guest or two, especially those persons you believe would be interested and would make worthy additions to our membership.
